Talking Points

- During child abuse and neglect prevention month it is important to talk about what each and every one of us can do to make sure that children in our community grow up healthy, safe and loved.
- Every child needs a caring adult in their lives for guidance and support. This
 nurturing love and attention helps them prepare for the future and keeps them
 safe from abuse and neglect.
- Behind every successful adult there was a positive mentor in their youth. This
 person could have been a family member, a neighbor, a teacher, a coach or
 a tutor.
- The campaign theme, "It's Your Turn to Make a Difference" reminds us that we all
 have a positive role to play in supporting our community's young people and their
 families.
- Child abuse and neglect is a symptom of a larger problem the lack of resources and support for families in our community.
- When the well-being of children and families becomes the priority of everyone
 in a community, the number of child abuse and neglect incidences will decrease.
 Other good things will also happen, including better health outcomes, improved
 school performance and family economic self-sufficiency.
- This month, it is important that every member of our community consider what
 they can do to improve our collective well-being. Whether it is volunteering,
 making donations or advocating for family-friendly policies, everyone can take
 their turn in making a difference.
- Pinwheels for Prevention is the national campaign utilizing the pinwheel as
 a symbol for child abuse and neglect prevention nationwide. The pinwheel
 represents efforts to change the way our nation thinks about prevention focusing
 on community activities and public policies that prioritize prevention right from the
 start to make sure child abuse and neglect never occur.
- Child abuse and neglect prevention month is an especially good time to talk
 about the five Protective Factors (Knowledge of Parenting & Child Development;
 Parental Resilience; Social Connections; Social and Emotional Development of
 Children; and Concrete Support in Times of Need) and how, when present, they
 increase the health and well-being of children and families.
