



Good Beginnings Mini-Grant Application

Background

Prevent Child Abuse West Virginia (PCAWV) is a state chapter of Prevent Child Abuse America, a national leader in building awareness, providing education, and inspiring hope in everyone involved in the effort to prevent child abuse and neglect. PCAWV is a program of TEAM for WV Children, a nonprofit organization that has been working with communities and families since 1986 to promote and advance the well-being of children, making their needs and healthy development a priority.

With funding support from the WV Department of Health & Human Resources, PCAWV is pleased to offer **Good Beginnings Mini-Grants** to support community-based child abuse and neglect prevention activities during the upcoming year. The goal of the Mini-Grants is to support one-time projects and serve as a catalyst for additional community-based prevention activities throughout the state. The guiding principle for the program is that everyone has a role in preventing child abuse and success depends upon having as many organizations, agencies, community groups and individuals working together as possible.

All projects are required to focus on primary prevention (activities aimed at the general population to prevent abuse and neglect <u>before</u> it occurs). Information about various evidence-based research findings and strategies that build family protective factors and prevent the occurrence of child abuse and neglect is available online at http://www.preventchildabusewv.org and https://www.childwelfare.gov/topics/prevention/ to help applicants design their proposed projects.

General Information

- Good Beginnings Mini-Grants will be awarded to support a variety of community-based projects aimed at preventing child abuse or neglect.
- Each project should be carefully designed with creative strategies for preventing or reducing the occurrence of child abuse or neglect.
- Up to 10 grants of up to \$1,000 per program will be awarded.
- The purpose of this grant program is <u>primary</u> prevention of child abuse and neglect.
- Applicants must be located in West Virginia and provide services to residents of West Virginia.
- Mini Grants are available to community-based organizations, public or private non-profit or faith-based organizations, or government agencies (e.g. schools or health departments), that provide communitybased programs for children and families.
- Applicants may submit only one proposal for the Good Beginnings Mini-Grant program this funding cycle.
- Funding term per grant is 5 months: Feb. 1, 2024 through June 30, 2024.
