TCPIP will accomplish this by: hosting quarterly child-parent events that will highlight the best practices of the five protective factors within our community; provide monthly activities (face-to-face or virtual) with our community partners for parents and children to instill social connectedness and community attachment; and celebrate and educate about child abuse prevention month.
